Proposal for a COUNCIL REGULATION

determining the categories of officials entitled to, and the conditions and rates of, allowances for regular standby duty.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

1. By Regulation (Euratom, ECSC, EEC) No 1601/75 of 24 June 1975 the Council amended Article 56b and the third paragraph of Article 55 of the Staff Regulations, deleting the phrase which restricted standby duty and the allowances for this work to officials paid from appropriations in the research and investment budget and employed in an establishment of the Joint Research Centre or on indirect action.

The amended text of Article 56b requires the Council, acting on a proposal from the Commission, presented after consulting the Staff Regulations Committee, to determine the categories of officials entitled to, and the conditions and rates of, allowances for standby duty.

2. The Commission proposal is attached. It takes account of the need for certain staff who are employed outside the Joint Research Centre to run and supervise technical installations or work in the medical service or as drivers, to remain at the disposal of their institution at the place of employment or at home, outside and in addition to normal working hours.

The conditions and rates of the proposed allowances are the same as those laid down for research staff in Council Regulation (Euratom) No 1371/72 of 27 June 1972.

However, to compensate to some extent for the disruption to family and social life caused by standby duty, it is proposed to grant one day's leave in some cases, for instance following seven days' continuous standby duty at home or standby duty at the place of employment on Saturdays, Sundays or public holidays.

3. As the representatives of the Staff Committees refused to attend meetings of the Staff Regulations Committee duly convened by the Chair since the beginning of February, the Staff Regulations Committee could not give an opinion on the Commission's proposal, which it received in September 1975.

In the absence of an opinion from the Staff Regulations Committee the Commission has adopted the attached proposal pursuant to Article 10a of the Staff Regulations.

Agreement was reached on the Commission proposal as a result of consultation with staff representatives before the proposal was presented to the Staff Regulations Committee.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Staff Regulations of Officials and the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants of the European Communities laid down in Regulation (EEC, Euratom, ECSC) No 259/68¹, as last amended by Regulation No², and in particular the second paragraph of Article 56b of the Staff Regulations,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas it is for the Council, acting on a proposal from the Commission, to determine

the categories of officials entitled to, and the conditions and rates of allowances which may be granted to officials who are regularly required to be at the disposal of the institution at the place of employment or at home outside normal working hours,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

1. Officials paid from appropriations in the research and investment budget and employed in an establishment of the Joint Research Centre or on indirect action, or paid from appropriations in the operating budget and employed to run or supervise technical installations or to work in the medical service or as drivers, who are regularly required to carry out standby duty in accordance with Article 56b of the Staff Regulations, shall be entitled to an allowance determined as follows:

- (a) The allowance shall be expressed in points. A point shall be equal to 0.032% of the basic salary of an official in Grade D4, Step 1. Such allowance shall be adjusted by the weighting applicable to the remuneration of the official;
- (b) The number of points per hour of actual standby duty shall be:
 - (i) for standby duty at the place of employment: 11 for working days and 22 for Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays;
 - (ii) for standby duty at home: 2.15 for working days and 4.3 for Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays.
- 2. No allowance shall be granted for standby duty at home if the actual period of duty is less than 14 hours.
- 3. An official who can show that for a period not exceeding one month he was prevented from doing standby duty at the place of employment as a result of illness or accident or because he was on annual leave shall retain his entitlement to the allowance. If he is prevented from doing standby duty for more than one month owing to sickness or accident, his entitlement to the allowance shall be suspended at the end of that month until he resumes work.

For the period referred to in the previous subparagraph, the official shall be entitled to an allowance of 42 points for each day of absence because of sickness, for which he has a medical certificate, or for each day of annual leave.

Article 2

The officials referred to in Article 1(1) shall also be entitled to:

(i) one day of leave for each period of standby duty at home involving at least 7 consecutive days, including absences for sickness or on leave; (ii) one day of leave for each Saturday, Sunday or public holiday on which they are actually required to carry out standby duty at the place of employment.

Article 3

This Regulation shall apply by analogy to temporary, auxiliary and establishment staff.

Article 4

Council Regulation (Euratom) No 1371/72 is hereby repealed.

Article 5

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities. However the provisions of the first, second and third articles take effect on the 1st July 1975.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
